PERMIT FOR OPEN BURNING

THESE CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED:

1. The burning shall be conducted as far away as practical from any highway or public road and controlled so that a traffic hazard is not created.
2. The burning shall not be conducted within one mile of any airport or landing strip, unless approved by the director.
3. The recipient of the permit or his authorized representative shall be present for the duration of any fire authorized by the permit.
4. This permit is subject to revocation at the discretion of a DNR Forest Officer, the local fire authority or the permit issuer.
5. Keep this fire under control and assume responsibility for all damages and costs that may result from burning done under this permit.
6. Do not burn if there is a practical alternative method for disposal of the material such as chipping or composting.
7. Use a clean burning device to start the fire.
8. Do not conduct burning during any air quality alert.
9. Extinguish the fire immediately if this permit is revoked.
10. The prevailing wind must be away from nearby occupied buildings.
11. Fires will not be allowed to smolder without flame.
12. Any person who starts and fails to control or extinguish the fire, whether on owned property or on the property of another, before the fire endangers or causes damage to the property of another person or the state is guilty of a misdemeanor.
13. Any person who has a burning permit and fails to keep the permitted fire contained within the area described on the burning permit or who fails to keep the fire restricted to the materials specifically listed on the burning permit is guilty of a misdemeanor.
14. The permittee must have the permit on their person and shall produce the permit for inspection when requested to do so by a forest officer, town fire warden, conservation officer, or other peace officer. The permittee shall remain with the fire at all times and before leaving the site shall completely extinguish the fire. A person shall not start or cause a fire to be started on any land that is not owned or under their legal control without the written permission of the owner, lessee, or an agent of the owner or lessee of the land. Violating or exceeding the permit conditions shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be cause for the permit to be revoked.
15. No person shall conduct, cause, or permit open burning of burnable building material generated from demolition of commercial or institutional structures. A farm building is not a commercial structure.
16. Contact Lakeville Fire Administrative office at 952-985-4700 to inform them that you are burning (office hours are Monday-Friday 8:00 am – 4:30 pm).

PROHIBITED MATERIALS: Oils, rubber, plastics, tires and chemically treated materials such as railroad ties, treated lumber, composite shingles, tar paper, insulation, composition board, sheet rock, wiring, paint, hazardous and industrial solid waste.

VIOLATIONS of permit conditions may subject permittee to criminal and/or civil actions.
